



### LET'S REDUCE OUR ENVIRONMENTAL FOOTPRINT

The FLC Solar Task Force is proposing to install a 22 kilowatt array of solar panels that will provide about 20% of our annual electricity usage. That amount of solar energy is the equivalent of burning 137,000 pounds of coal. Coal burning is the most polluting method of generating electricity. Depending on the type of coal burned and emissions controls, various amounts of cancer causing particulates, nitrogen and sulfur oxides and CO2 are released into the air, contributing to human disease, acid rain, lake acidification, smog, and climate change. Coal also contains mercury which is released into the air and eventually enters aquatic systems, where it is transformed into methyl mercury, a neurotoxin that contaminates our fish. **Solar Task Force & Creation Care Ministry**
