## Sermons at First Lutheran Church (ELCA) Reggie Denton, Pastor

January 12, 2025 (The Baptism of Our Lord, Year C) Luke 3:15-17, 21-22 Isaiah 43:1-7

How many of you remember the old Johnny Cash song "A boy named Sue"? I love that song. It cracks me up. He sang,

My daddy left home when I was three

And he didn't leave much to ma and me

Just this old guitar and an empty bottle of booze.

Now, I don't blame him cause he run and hid

But the meanest thing that he ever did

Was before he left, he went and named me "Sue."

Now as the song goes, he was always picked on because of his name, so he grew up to be a fighter. He said, "I tell ya, life ain't easy for a boy named 'Sue."

He <u>HATED</u> his father for giving him that awful name. One day he found his dad in a bar and he confronted him. And his dad said,

Son, this world is rough

And if a man's gonna make it, he's gotta be tough

And I knew I wouldn't be there to help ya along.

So I give ya that name and I said goodbye

I knew you'd have to get tough or die

And it's the name that helped to make you strong.

And Sue realized that the name <u>HAD</u> made him tough. It shaped who he was. So at the end of the song he sings,

And I think about him, now and then,

Every time I try and every time I win,

And if I ever have a son, I think I'm gonna name him...

BILL OR GEORGE, ANYTHING BUT SUE, I STILL HATE THAT NAME!!"

The whole song is about the power of a <u>NAME</u>. Names <u>HAVE</u> <u>POWER</u>. They tell us who we ARE.

So <u>GIVING</u> a name to a child is an important <u>DECISION</u> for <u>ALL</u> parents. That name will be <u>WITH</u> their son or daughter for their whole life. Names distinguish our personal <u>IDENTITY</u>, <u>WHO</u> we are.

And children <u>LOVE</u> to hear stories of <u>HOW</u> their names were <u>CHOSEN</u>, so they can know their place in the world, and their place in their family.

For example, my boy Samuel's middle name is Harry, after his grandfather, my wife's dad, and <u>HIS</u> dad, <u>AND</u> Wendy's grandfather on her <u>MOM'S</u> side too.

My girl Annabelle owes <u>SOME</u> of her name to her aunt LeAnna. And her <u>MIDDLE</u> name is Betty, after <u>BOTH MY MOM</u> and <u>WENDY'S GRANDMA</u>.

Myself, I was named after my dad's best friend in the Army. That's why it's just Reggie and not Reginald. (If you don't remember me saying it before, don't call me that.) It's <u>REGGIE</u>, (that's what my birth certificate says) because I was named <u>AFTER</u> someone. Names are passed down from generation to generation.

Many of our names came from baby <u>BOOKS</u>, because our parents liked the <u>MEANING</u> of our name. <u>ANNABELLE'S</u> name means <u>GRACE AND BEAUTY</u>. It fits her.

Some of us are named after favorite characters from books or movies, or from the Bible. That's where we got the name Samuel.

Our names can say a <u>LOT</u> about us. But no matter <u>WHERE</u> your name came from, some of the most <u>SIGNIFICANT</u> events in our lives are moments when <u>GOD CALLS</u> us by name. When you were baptized, your name was announced as your sponsors presented you. At baptism and confirmation, we prayed for the gift of the Holy Spirit <u>SPECIFICALLY</u> for <u>YOU</u>. We call a husband and a wife by name in the service for marriage. People who receive prayer for <u>HEALING</u> hear their individual names addressed to God. Finally at death, we commend <u>EVERY</u> Christian to God by <u>NAME</u>, in the liturgies for commendation of the dying and for burial.

On <u>THIS</u> day, the Baptism of Our Lord, we remember the <u>FIRST</u> of those events—our <u>BAPTISM</u>. In <u>CHRIST'S</u> baptism, <u>HE</u> was given a name, "beloved son." In <u>OUR</u> baptism, <u>WE</u> are given a name <u>ALSO</u>, the name that is ours for all eternity, "child of God."

Isaiah described it well:

But now thus says the Lord, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by NAME, YOU ARE MINE.... You are precious in my sight, and honored, and I love you.

That's <u>GOD</u> speaking <u>THROUGH</u> Isaiah there! This is remarkable, because this is the <u>ONLY</u> place in the <u>WHOLE</u> Bible were God <u>HIMSELF</u> speaks those words: "I love you."

In our baptism, <u>GOD NAMES</u> us. Consider that for a moment – God the almighty, the creator and master of the universe, calls <u>YOU</u> by name, claims <u>YOU</u> as his own.

I keep this piece in my office. You might have heard it before.

- → If God had a refrigerator, your picture would be on it.
- → If God had a wallet, your photo would be in it.
- → He sends you flowers every spring and a sunrise every morning.
- → Whenever you want to talk, He'll listen.
- ★ Face it, God's <u>CRAZY</u> about you.

All the things the <u>WORLD</u> tells us we have to <u>DO</u>, or <u>HAVE</u>, or <u>BE</u> to have any <u>VALUE</u> – <u>NONE</u> of that matters. We <u>ALREADY</u> have value—in <u>GOD'S</u> eyes. When Jesus came to the Jordan, he hadn't <u>DONE ANYTHING</u> yet. His ministry didn't begin until <u>AFTER</u> his baptism. But God was <u>ALREADY</u> pleased with him. God was pleased with him for <u>ONE</u> reason and one reason only – the <u>SAME</u> reason you and I would give our <u>LIFE</u> for our children from the moment they're <u>BORN</u>, and even <u>BEFORE</u> – because they're <u>OURS</u>. The <u>FATHER</u> was <u>PLEASED</u> with Jesus <u>SIMPLY</u> for who he <u>WAS</u>.

So the words that God spoke to <u>JESUS</u> that day at the river Jordan, he <u>ALSO</u> speaks to you and me: "You are my <u>CHILD</u>, the Beloved; with <u>YOU</u> I am well pleased." Hear that again, because those words are for <u>YOU</u>: "You are <u>MY</u> child...with <u>YOU</u> I am well pleased." In baptism, you are given a name, and that name <u>IS</u> "child of God."

So brothers and sisters, know this: God is <u>PLEASED</u> with you, and <u>YOU ARE</u> loved. Not because of anything you have done; but <u>SIMPLY</u> because <u>YOU ARE HIS</u>.

You have a big name to live up to. **EVEN** if you're **ALSO** a "boy named Sue." Amen.
